



2025 Audrey Walton Youth Leadership Conference Application



The Audrey Walton Youth Leadership Conference (AWYLC) provides opportunities for Missouri youth (high school juniors and seniors) to gain skills that will assist them in becoming leaders in their communities and schools. Named after and generally sponsored by Audrey Walton, a great leader in her own right, this program promotes the importance of leadership, physical fitness, higher education, and a healthy lifestyle. During the 2-day conference, we will engage in several activities that will encourage the students to step up and be leaders amongst themselves. All of the students will participate in both indoor and outdoor team activities. The Audrey Walton Youth Leadership Program is certainly an experience that will help any student become a true leader in his or her school and community.

When? Thursday, July 17– Friday, July 18, 2025

Where? University of Missouri, Columbia, Missouri. Participants will stay in an MU residence hall with an assigned roommate of the same gender and attend the conference's events at various locations on campus.

Who Can Apply? High school students entering their junior or senior year in school for the 2025-2026 school year.

Cost? There is little cost to participants. Lodging, as well as most meals, are provided by the Show-Me STATE GAMES. If participants plan to drive themselves and park overnight, they will need to purchase a parking pass from MU Parking. Participants might want to bring a little spending money for souvenirs and any extra snacks they wish to have.

Excellent Expectations Form

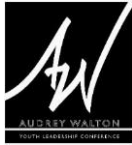
